Managed care organizations (MCOs) empower members to engage with their own healthcare, providing education and support for preventive care services. This helps members find the right care, at the right time, from the right setting.

Real Results

In Pennsylvania



were provided through the Medicaid managed care model in 2017.¹

In Kentucky



MCOs are helping to facilitate access to **medication-assisted treatment**, which leverages the use of medications, counseling, and behavioral therapies to provide a holistic approach to **treating substance-use disorders**.²

In Florida



MCOs provide additional benefits, including **substance abuse and mental health treatment** and **vaccines** for adults.³

In Washington



MCOs **increased well-child visits** and primary care access for children under 24 months.⁴

In Nevada



Increased the number of adolescents who received **well-care visits** by 11%.⁵

Better Performance



MCOs are held accountable through quality scores known as the Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS), which track MCO performance against more than 90 quality measures.



MCOs leverage advanced data modeling and analytics to determine when to encourage members to seek preventive care.
